

WHO WE ARE...

To this end, the Guild has recently redeveloped their Sydney headquarters in Concord West into a three storey *Centre of Excellence for Embroidery and Textile Arts*, which includes a specialist textile library, collection room, shop, workshop and classrooms, as well as gallery space - Gallery76, for the further promotion of textile art and textile artists.

Education has always been a key part of the Guild's activities with dedicated Education, Junior & Students Teams overseeing our Junior Stitches Clubs across the state, workshops from visiting artists, Summer School programme, and High-School programmes.

Gallery76 is the Sydney's only specialist textile art gallery and hosts exhibitions of both contemporary and historic textile and embroidery art, from established artists, to student work.

WHAT WE DO...

In addition to our regular school holiday programme, we run tailored classes for Textiles & Design, Visual Art, and Design & Technology students in Years 10 - 12. Our experienced members will take students through a variety of tools, techniques and stitches and show how they can be used for best effect, whether it be in art or fashion.

For Textiles Study Days held at the Guild, students may also enjoy the current textile art exhibition at Gallery76 and explore pieces from the Guild's historical, cultural and contemporary collections, which include pieces from well-known contemporary textile artists and embroiderers, historical dress items, early examples of machine embroidery, and more!






Study Days (In schools)	<p>Study Days taught in schools will focus on the practical skills and manipulation of textiles that will introduce students to a range of embroidery stitches and how they can be employed to best effect, whether it be in fashion, art or a mixed media project.</p> <p>By the end of the day, each student will have completed a sample piece of various embroidery stitches which can be creatively employed by students in their work.</p> <p>Guild instructors will also bring a small selection of embroidery art pieces and samples to illustrate the different ways these stitches can be used.</p>	Charges depending on workshop materials and tutor travel cost.
Study Days (At Guild's Centre of Excellence for Embroidery and Textile Arts)	<p>Study Days taught at the Guild will, in ADDITION to the practical introduction to stitches included in the 'in-school' study day, include a presentation of pieces from the Guild's Historic, Cultural and Contemporary Collection.</p> <p>Studying original and historical garments are an important research method for practising designers and couture houses - exposure to historical textile collections and archives opens students to practical research methods undertaken by such practitioners.*</p> <p>A Study Day at the Guild will also give the students the opportunity to view the current textile art exhibition on display at the Guild's on-site gallery, Gallery76. We have a monthly turnover of exhibitions featuring historical textiles and contemporary textile artists. A presentation on the current exhibition can be included on request.</p> <p>These Study Days and presentations can be tailored to suit students' needs and may be arranged with the Guild in advance.</p>	Charges depending on workshop materials.
